Our outings are all put into place and I expect the buses to both of the Shawnee day trips to be filled to capacity. The Hudson Valley Outing is expected to be another outstanding event and I strongly recommend that you start making plans to be there.

At the present we have 88 members in our ranks. We do have a waiting list for the coming season, but if you haven't done so already now is the time to invite perspective members into our club.

## League Play to start on Opening Day... Flight C Players to Tee Off from Middle Tees

League Play format will basically remain the same, however, the start of league play will begin on April 5th, 2006 and end on August 16th, 2006. Last year several members missed qualifying for the Match Play Tournament (MPT) by a week or two. Just to refresh your memory in order to qualify for the MPT you must finish in the top eight places in you respected Flights. Only the ten lowest net scores will count. Last year due to rain outs, etc. it left less than sixteen weeks for members to qualify. This year by starting to record all scores from day one it will give everyone a better chance to be eligible for the MPT finals. In the event of a tie for the eighth place position an eighteen hole playoff will be required. Following are the handicap break down for each flight: Flight A 10 to 19, Flight B 20 to 24, Flight C 25 to 31 and Flight D 32to 38. The plan is to adjust the stroke differential in each flight and maintain an approximate equal number of members within each of the flights.

The other major change to take place is to move all in the Flight C group from the forward tees back to the middle tees. Previously the C & D Flights both hit from the forward tees. After evaluating the scores and handicaps and realigning the Flights,

the Tournament Committee has decided that for the 2006 season the C Flight will hit from the white tees and the D Flight will use the forward tees.

#### **Tournaments, Prizes & Tidbits:**

The year-end Club Tournament will be eligible to all members that did not qualify for the Match Play Playoff and members that lost in the first round of Match Play Playoff. Only the top four finishers will receive prizes in the Match Play Championship. The Club Tournament will be a two-week event similar to those held in the past years.

The prize fund for the Club Tournament and the Special Tournaments will be announced at a later date. **Tiebreakers** in the Match Play Tournament will be decided by a sudden death playoff. Tiebreakers in the Club Tournament will be decided by a matching of holes start-

ing with the first hole. The Spring Tournament last year was a two-man team total net score event, plans are to re-evaluate this format and perhaps modify it to make it more exciting. The Fall Tournament will be a four-man team best ball scramble event. Sweeps, because of budget cuts, will be discontinued and if feasible it may go back to how it was run in the past. Closest to the pin will continue every week on one of the par threes on the front and one of the par threes on the back with a \$5.00 prize going to the winners. Weekly Check-in time span for reporting in will be from 6:30 am to 8:15 am. Due to the construction going on we need your cooperation now more than ever, please cooperate! Forward Tees will continue to be used by the players in the D Flight only.

Golf Courses from Long Island to Upstate New York and Pennsylvania were solicited. One of the biggest problems was negotiating a shot gun start and most of the courses wanted a guarantee of 120 golfers. Some courses on Long Island would accommodate us but the prices for the outing would cost you \$135 and up. Courses in NY and PA did not have June dates available. Shawnee Inn knowing how upset we were on the condition of the golf course last year were very apologetic and made us an offer that we could not refuse and it guaranteed that the golf course will be in tip-top shape. Therefore with the prices that we were experiencing from other venues we will be able to hold the price at \$100 per person for each of these outings.
