We now have 93 members in our ranks and fourteen new applicants are on our wait list. Since our by-laws allows a hundred members in our club we will invite only seven applicants to be processed into the club, so if you sponsored someone and they are not called at this time, please be patient.

There is now a area of concern that needs to be addressed and that is the replacement of officers and board members in our club. Beginning with yours truly the burn out is beginning to show, it's time for change.

League Play seeks to end Tee Box Dilemma

League Play format will basically remain the same, however, the tournament committee will place the following restriction on Flight A, Flight B and Fight C players-must hit their tee shots form the white tees. Flight D players—must hit their tee shots from the forward tees. The reason is that our records show that when a player in Flight A, B or C hits from the blue tees and a Flight D player hits from the white tees their handicap is higher due to the longer distances from the respective tee boxes. If these players used there assigned tee boxes the handicaps would prove to be lower. This is especially important when running our tournaments and it is necessary to calculate handicaps fairly. Starting with this season if any player caught not hitting from their assigned tee box they will have their score disqualified for that round.

Following are the handicap breakdowns for each flight: Flight A—8 to 20, Flight B—21 to 26, Flight C—27 to 30 and Flight D—31 to 37. Just to refresh your memory in order to qualify for the Match Play Championship you must finish in the top eight places in you respected Flights. Only the total of your season ten lowest net scores will count in the League Play standings. In the Match Play Championship, contenders will

get 80% of handicap in determining the strokes given.

To avoid having to play our year end matches in poor conditions (when management has scheduled aeration of the greens), changes will be made to the CSGC schedule. Any ties at the end of League Play for positions 1-8 in each flight will require an 18 hole playoff. Tiebreakers in the Match Play Championship (MPC) will remain the same (a one hole sudden death playoff). If there is still a tie then there will be a matching of the cards to break the tie.

In the year-end Club Net Tournament (CNT) normally you pick up if you score four over par on any hole, you must now hole out. Therefore, if it takes ten strokes to hole out on any particular hole you must enter a ten on your score card. In the event of a tie (first place only) there will be a playoff to be scheduled by the Tournament Committee. If after a playoff there is still

a tie, the Committee will decide the winner by a matching of cards.

Should there be a rainout on any of the tournament dates the Committee will decide if/when that round will be re-scheduled.

Tournaments, Prizes & Tidbits:

The prize funds for (MPC) and (CNT) will follow the same format as last year, except in the (MPC) positions 5-8 and the (CNT) prizes will be up graded. The Spring Tournament will be a four-man team total net score event. The Fall Tournament will be a four-man team best ball scramble event. Closest to the pin will continue every week on the following par threes: on the front—hole 7 and on the back—hole 12 with a \$5.00 prize going to the winners. Weekly Check-in time span for reporting in will be from 6:30 am to 8:00 am.
