Year-End Championship Rounds Restructured!

One of the problems at the end of the year was setting up the brackets and having those members who qualified to be on hand to play out their rounds in the Match Play Championships. Members who were unable to play their match had to default, in some cases it was the final round of the championship and the Champion was declared by default. Second was the way our League Play was run., it was a net stroke play format and the ten lowest scores counted for positioning (one through eight) at the end of the season. Many members were unable to play ten rounds during the year and more important low handicappers in each flight were unable to compete in a net stroke format. Therefore it was determined that this was not a true championship if the best players were unable to compete in it.

At our last General Membership Meeting several mem-

bers voiced their opinions as to what changes needed to be made and how to make our championship tournaments fair and competitive. Letters with ideas were received by General Chairman Bill Doyle who compiled these letters and presented them to our Board of Governors.

Following changes have been made for the 2010 season:

There will be no League Play this year.

The Club Championship will be open to all members, stroke play, lowest combined gross score of the three days to determine the Champion and Flight Winners. The Club Championship is scheduled for August 11, 18 and 25.

The Presidents Cup is new this year, stroke play, lowest combined <u>net</u> of the two days to determine the winners in all flights. (full handicap allowed)

The prize funds are still being worked on and will be announced at a later date.

Tournaments, Prizes & Tidbits:

Closest to the pin will continue every week on the following par threes: on the front—hole 7 and on the back—hole 12 with a \$5.00 prize going to the winners.

This year if a member is closest to the pin on both holes on the same day he will receive two prizes. One second place prize will go to the closest distance between the two holes.

Weekly Check-in time span for reporting in will be from 6:30 am to 7:30 am.

Pick your own foursomes there will be one Wednesday a month during May, June and July where you will be permitted to make up your own group.
