The Special Tournaments that are being planned for the next two months will serve a dual purpose. First we want to have a team format that



The annoying Game of Golf! One of the biggest gripes in golf is slow play, so with the season just a few months gone it is not too late to review ways to speed up play.

Be attentive when players in your foursome have hit their ball to help with it's location and be aware of the two minute time limit when looking for a lost ball then move on. Always play when ready. Members that ride in golf carts drop your partner at his ball and then ride to your ball, after hitting meet in the middle of the fairway, do not waste time putting your club in your golf bag that can be done at your next shot, after every one has holed out move promptly off the green and mark score card at next tee box. Some players take excessive practice swings or take time dwelling on a shot or putt. It is each foursome's responsibility to stay close to the group in front of you. So when the getting gets slow *Pick it up a Notch*.
