Notes from the Editor

Slow Play continues to be a thorn in our side. Since the beginning of the season groups have fallen consistently behind one hole to two and half holes of the group in front. A phone call from Clearview Golf Course (CGC) was made to president Bill Doyle asking him to address this matter. Should it continue management of CGC will warn groups that play slow that they may be moved to an appropriate position on the course in order to speed up play. This prompted our club to issue a *Ready Golf Specifics* and it is worth mentioning again.

If each player in a foursome saves only five seconds per shot, each round of golf would be shortened by 30 minutes.

Tee Box:

- First player who is ready should hit
- Tee off when group in front is clear
- Always carry an extra ball in your pocket.

Fairway:

- Take extra clubs with you.
- Drop off your cart passenger, than drive to your ball.
- Players on opposite sides of the fairway can hit simultaneously.
- Hit when ready and safe; do not use honor system.
- Have your group watch where each shot goes.
- Limit search for lost balls to 2 minutes.
- Pick up at four over par.

Green:

- Place your cart or bag between the green and next tee.
- Once you finish putting leave the green.
- Complete your score card at the next tee.

General:

- Keep pace with the group ahead.
- Stay within one shot of the group ahead
- Be alert and ready to play when it is your turn.
- Keep practice swings to minimum.
