# Al Marcus—Last Active Charter Member

I find it intriguing that at the age of 91 years young Al continues at a very active pace. Many of our members marvel at how young he looks and the incentive that he generates for all of us to keep up with him and enjoy the game of golf as he has for many years.

Al started playing golf in

1928 and the first course he played was at Silver Lake in Staten Island. At that time Al worked for



the B & O Al Marcus—1928 Railroad and played most of the city golf courses when green fees at that time were \$1.25. Once Clearview Golf Course went public he played there from time to time. He eventually moved to Forest Hills South, Queens in 1941 and began to play at Clearview regularly.

During the early 1970's Al played with a group of

Seniors and they would play two to three times a week. Al's most memorable moment occurred August 20, 1973, his first and only hole in one on the 12th hole at Clearview Golf Course. As the group of Seniors began to grow, the idea of starting a golf club began to fall into place and in 1975 The Clearview Seniors Golf Club became a reality. In 1976 Ben Sander was elected as the club's first President and following are some of the early members instrumental in organizing the club: Rubin Adelman, Al Black, Jim Burke, Bob Cole, John Furey, Ed Golden, Ted Helkowski, Bob Mayer, Bob Rodgers, Sol Schoenberg, Emil Zerenga, Sid Zieglar.

Some of the memorable moments Al has of CSGC was of Bob Rodgers who ran Golf outings at Stevensville, Kutsher's, Mid-Island and Bethpage to name a few. Rubin Adleman was chairman of the first of many Annual Dinner Dances and

became a very popular M.C. because of his battery operated flashing bow tie. Al was very impressed with Steve Melish and Nick Derrico, both of these men had a great golf swing and personalities to match. Other close golf buddies in the early years were Leon Fiedler, Sam Smith, Al Forman and Morris Gustav.

For the past 22 years Al has averaged three rounds of golf a week, both here and in Florida. Al's record year was in 1976 when he played 132 games of golf on city courses and he still has the cashier stubs to prove it. Al has been a Florida Snowbird since 1980 and presently has a place in Delray Beach. Al's wife Maxine expresses a desire to relocate in Florida and this may well be Al's last year as a CSGC active member.

Over the years Al Marcus has been a loyal and dedicated member and his generosity to the club has been very much appreciated and he will long be remembered.


