John Gomilas, Andrew Murphy and Lou Stovell 2003 Club Champions.

John Gomilas, Andrew Murphy and Lou Stovell each survived a tight finish in the match play finals to win the championship in flights A, B and C respectively.

It was undecided who the eight finalists would be until the last day of league play. Flight A proved to be the most exciting when the last four players to qualify were separated by a total net of four strokes overall. The final standings for each flight 1-8 made it into the match play playoff championship and they were as follows:

In the first round four players from each of the flights that lost became eligible to participate in the Club Tournament. In the second round the pressure began to mount Flight A—

Gomilas defeated Holewa 2 up with 1 to go and Simone defeated Meehan 1 up with 0 to go. Flight B—Salvato defeated Ferguson 3 up with 2 to go, A. Murphy defeated Albi 2 up with 1 to go. Flight C—Tobacco defeated Murray 5 up with 4 to go, Stovell defeated Kenny 3 up with 2 to go.

In the championship round Flight A—Gomilas defeated Simone 3 up with 2 to go, Meehan came in third and Holewa came in fourth place. Flight B—A. Murphy defeated Salvato 3 up with 2 to go, Albi came in third and Ferguson came in fourth place. Flight C—Stovell defeated Tobacco 2 up with 1 to go, Kenny came in third and Murray came in fourth place. It was another exciting ending to a great season.

The remaining members competed in a two round total net stroke Club Tournament with prizes being awarded to the first four places in each of the flights. Flight A—Jim Byrne won by four strokes, but there was a tie for second

between Tom Faraone, Clancy Takano and Jerome Greene. The tie breaker was determined by a matching of holes, on the first hole all the players got a 5, on the second hole all the players got a 6, on the third hole Faraone scored a 4, Takano scored a 5 and Greene scored a 7 concluding the first four finishers. Flight B—Steve Panagakos ran away from the field by seven strokes, second place John Staiano, third place Joe Valenza and fourth place Art Demarest each finished one stroke behind one another. Flight C—Shelly Friedman and Hugh McKeever tied for first place and the tie breaker was decided on the first hole when Friedman scored a 5 and McKeever scored a 7. Third place went to Lou Wirtzer and one stroke behind in fourth place was Ed Magas.

Once again the tournament committee out did themselves with an outstanding job of compiling and recording the scores. Honorable mention goes to Joe Salvato our computer guru.
